We welcome Imam Dr. Imad Enchassi as our special guest today.

Dr. Imam Imad Enchassi is a Senior Imam at the Islamic Society of Greater Oklahoma City, a Chair of Islamic Studies at Oklahoma City University, and an adjunct professor at both Phillips Theological Seminary and Saint Paul School of Theology. Dr. Enchassi is an educator, interfaith leader, writer, lecturer, activist, and public speaker. Dr. Enchassi has earned two Ph.Ds. in Human Resources and Theology. He is the recipient of many interfaith, community, and inclusion awards.

In 2010, the Daily Oklahoman named him 'the Religious Visionary of the Year.' Dr. Imad Enchassi is the advisor for those minoring in the interfaith degree program at Oklahoma City University. He is a member of the Diversity and Inclusion committee at Oklahoma City University. He has been featured in many local, national, and international media outlets, such as CNN, MSNBC, ABC, Al Jazeera, and Al Arabia.

Dr. Enchassi teaches graduate and undergraduate courses on the subjects of Where Religions Meet, Interfaith and Pluralism, Muslim Experience in America, Survey of the Major Themes of the Qur’an, and Engaging World’s Neighbor. He is the author of Cloud Miles: A Remarkable Journey of Mercy, Peace, and Purpose. Dr. Enchassi is a founder of many educational, social, religious, and charitable organizations including Mercy Mission building which houses a food pantry, soup kitchen, free clinic, a women’s resource center, and a homeless shelter. Dr. Enchassi has worked with many partners in the community including local, state, and federal law enforcement officers toward community relations and community building. His passion for peace and love stems from his upbringing in war zones and him surviving a massacre in 1982.
